DR. MORTON "MOE" TENER

Dr. Morton "Moe" Tener's main existence consists of three areas - his family, academics at Rowan College and directing his residential summer camp for children in the Pocono Mountains which he has done for thirty-nine years.

Dr. Moe is in his 28th year at Glassboro-Rowan College and his 39th year in New Jersey education. Prior to coming to Glassboro-Rowan College he was a teacher, basketball coach, guidance counselor and vice-principal in different school districts in South Jersey. Out of all the educational experiences, his greatest love is working with student teachers.

Moe has had 54 articles published on various topics in a variety of magazines. The topics include camping, athletics, education, parenting, etc. in some of the many following journals - Balance Sheet, Business Forum, Business Education Observer, Education Digest, Scholastic Coach, Athletic Journal, Parents Guide, Camping Magazine, etc.

His educational training includes B.S.-Rider University, M.S.-Temple University, M.S.-U. of PA, Ed.D.-Temple University, post doctoral courses-Temple University.

As a high school and college student, Moe was best known for his feats on the basketball court. In high school he made the all Philadelphia Public High School basketball team in 1949. In December of 1952 for about three weeks he was one of the high scorers in the nation among small colleges. In March of 1953 Moe traveled with the Harlem Globe Trotters on the opposition team, the Washington Generals, for a short period of time. In 1978 he was chairman of the Junior Israeli Olympics in this region.
